

Permanent Civil War case exhibit added to Museum

2011 marks the 150th anniversary of the American Civil War. The Mt. Horeb Area Museum's exhibit, *Ethnicity & Civil War* takes a look and a new approach to an old subject.

Shortly after their arrival Southwestern Dane County's immigrants from Germany, Ireland, Norway, Scotland and Switzerland found themselves embroiled in national conflict. What were their reactions to this very personal war? The

goal of this exhibit is to shed light on this important question. Today's scholarly commentary, coupled with historic letters, documents, photos and artifacts bring this story to the local level for the first time.

Premiere of Limited Edition "Then & Now" Book

More than a year in the making, the Mt. Horeb Area Historical Society's new book "Mt. Horeb Area Then & Now: Celebrating Mt. Horeb's 150th and Southwestern Dane County" will be available for sale.

The book turned out to be an object of art. Never before has a Mt. Horeb area publication compared photos from the past to those of the present, or included artistic full color prints. Never before has a book looked at the specific history of Southwestern Dane County from

pre-settlement to the present, including overviews of area townships and villages.

The book contains 128 pages bound between a colorful hard cover with dozens of thought-provoking images from the area's past and present. Included are the townships of Blue Mounds, Perry, Primrose, Springdale, Vermont and part of Cross Plains. The villages photographically represented in the publication are Blue Mounds, Daleyville, Forward, Pokerville, Pine Bluff, Mt. Horeb, Riley, and Mt. Vernon.

An example of one of the photo comparisons of the "Then & Now" book: Main Street Looking West circa 1915 and 2010



Quilt Exhibit brings to life the Names, Faces and Stories

Stories in Stitches: Quilts of Southwestern Dane County exhibit in the museum's Centennial Gallery reveals through craft the daily events that affected the makers of these everyday bed coverings and works of art. Quilts dating from 1855-1998 were selected from the Historical Society's extensive textile collections for the poignant stories they tell us. These objects represent the technological changes and life experiences that occurred both nationally and in Southwestern Dane County: stories of anniversaries and reunions, settlement and war, mortality and the Great Depression.

In addition, a companion exhibit is scheduled during the Fall Heritage Festival on October 1– 2, 2011.
